NADSFL began in 1984 with one facilitator (Mimi Met) and five additional founding members, including Marty Abbott, Christy Brown, Paul Garcia, John Harrison, and Maria Wilmeth.

In 1987 dues were \$10 a year, and the Regional Representatives came on board.

In 1988, NADSFL elected its first president

In 1999, the Supervisor of the Year Award was developed and The Characteristics of Effective Foreign Language Instruction were developed.

In 2006, the first Summer Academy was held with 14 attendees.

In 2008, a co-sponsorship status was formed with ACTFL.

In 2015, NADSFL launched The Principles of Effective World Language Programs.
